That being said, let's talk masks: are they effective and who are they protecting? The answer is that it depends on the type of mask.

According to the World Health Organization, there are 6 vaccines in phase III of study, the final stage before approval for public use. 
Edgar Allen Poe Poem "The Bells" examines the sound of bells as the four major milestones of human experience— childhood, youth, maturity and death.

Sometimes it's difficult to catch some of the smaller events, especially now that the U.S. and a few other countries are hitting election time. What may not have been drawn to your attention in the flurry of news is that as of May 2019 nearly 30 million acres of U.S. farmland are being held by foreign investors. This means that roughly 1.3% of American soil is owned by foreign entities not including US territories.

Land ownership limitations vary from state to state, so it is likely that foreign entities will continue to buy more American land, especially in states with no restrictions on ownership. For example, if you compare Texas to Iowa, Texas is a free for all with no limits on how much land can be owned and who can own it. Iowa, on the other hand, has restrictions in place and therefore has no land owned by a foreign entity. Why are other countries interested in American land?

There are a few reasons: natural resources (ie: oil and timberland), investment properties, and gains due to the American economy to name a few. Surprisingly enough, the top five foreign buyers of U.S. real estate in 2019 were China (\$13.4B), Canada (\$8.0B), India (\$6.9B), United Kingdom (\$3.8B), and Mexico (\$2.3B) with the top 5 destinations being Florida (20%), California (12%), Texas (10%), Arizona (5%) and New Jersey (4%).

Speaking of China and American resources, the Chinese developed application known as TikTok is not yet scheduled to be shut down in the U.S. as of right now, however there has been talk of having the popular app banned. Why? TikTok may have potential security risks involving its user's voluntarily given personal information and the information the app collects from the user's phone. The concern is so gray that the US Army and Navy have both completely banned use of the app until further notice.

While everyone else was focused on the next government stimulus check, we here at Arbitrage Trade Analytics are watching conversations regarding Universal Basic Income (UBI). Before we talk about which companies will be piloting this idea, let's first look at what UBI Income is. UBI is a theoretical governmental public program that would deliver periodic payments to all citizens of a given population without a means test or work requirement. In other words, everyone living in an area offering UBI would have unconditional income that meets their basic needs which would default everyone at or above the poverty line.

There are a few reasons that UBI has become a topic that has been discussed more and more in recent years- one of them being that eventually many jobs will be automated, resulting in less available jobs than there are human being to work.

One of the positives of UBI is that in the event that large industries end up being completely automated (ie: agriculture), UBI allows those who have lost work to pursue higher education or other needed skills which would result in less stress for the unemployed citizen while also increasing economic growth. Of course, there has been some discussion of UBI creating a people who would "get lazy" and not feel the need to work as much.

There has been some talk of using smaller cities or towns as use cases for UBI. Currently several North American entities are planning to implement some level of UBI in specific cities as use cases. These entities include but are not limited to California, USA; Alaska, USA; Illinois, USA; Ontario, CAN; and Mississippi, USA.

Speaking of UBI, the federal reserve has recently minted it's own crypto currency that is loosely based on BITCOIIN. If it catches on at the same time UBI is introduced this could quickly add up to a new national currency that is still backed by the US dollar.



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
